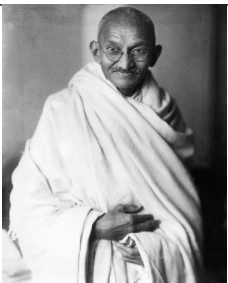
Key information
