Key information

- Muslims main source of wisdom are the Quran or the Hadith. The Quran giving direct guidance from God himself.
- Christians main source of wisdom is the Bible made up out of the Old Testament (Jewish Torah) and the New Testament- (an account of the life of Jesus and the works of his early followers).
- Hindus main source of wisdom is the Vedas which are scriptures.

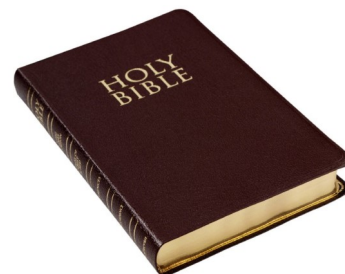
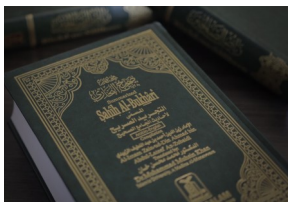
Key Vocabulary

Quran and Hadith	They are both sources of Wisdom for Muslims.
Bible	The Holy bible is the source of Wisdom for Christians.
Vedas	A source of wisdom for Hindus.
scriptures	The sacred writing of a religion.
Moral codes	A written, formal and consistent set of rules prescribing righteous behaviour, accepted by a person or by a group of people.
Dharma	A Hindu word for religious duty for giving to charity.
Artha	A Hindu word for gaining wealth by honest means.
