- All religious buildings are unique to their religion and beliefs. They are made in unique ways and include artefacts and religious objects to support worshipping inside.

worship	The act of worshipping God or Gods by singing or praying.
Mosque	A building where Muslims go to worship.
Mandir	A temple where Hindu people go to worship.

liturgy	A fixed form of prayers and actions used in a public worship in some religions, especially Christianity.
prayer	Words that you say to God or Gods to give thanks or ask for help.
spiritual	When someone is connected with a religion.
